




HIGHWAY 101'S PAULETTE CARLSON

WITH SPECIAL GUEST SAMMY SADLER

You're Invited to hear the legendary music of Highway 101, with founder and lead singer Paulette Carlson, singing their unforgettable hits., with her special guest Sammy Sadler.

Paulette, known for her distinct vocal sound and style, led Highway 101 to fame and the top of the Billboard charts. With Paul Worley and Ed Seay producing, Warner Brother's Highway 101 charted four number one hit singles and seven top ten hits. Winning both Country Music Association and Academy of Country Music awards for Vocal Group of the Year, in both 1988 and 1989, their place in country music history was secured. Their first hit, written by Paulette, was The Bed You Made for Me. The song was credited for establishing their unique sound and paved the way for many more hits. Whiskey If You Were A Woman, Somewhere Tonight, Cry Cry Cry, Who's Lonely Now, Walkin' Talkin' Cryin' Barely Beatin' Broken Heart, I'd Say Yes, and many others followed and climbed the charts.



As a young woman, Paulette arrived in Nashville from the country music clubs of Fargo, North Dakota. Her talent was soon recognized, and she was quickly signed as a songwriter for the Oak Ridge Boys' publishing company, Silverline Goldline. Duane Allen placed Paulette with RCA Records, where her first recordings, including Can You Fool, are still regarded as true and beautiful classics of the country music genre. One of Paulette's favorite projects was an album she produced entitled, It's About Time, dedicated to our country's Vietnam Veterans. The signature song on the album is Thank You Vets, and was written for her brother Gary, who served in that conflict.

Paulette brings in special guest, Sammy Sadler, known for his classic country voice, musical talent, and flare for entertaining. Sammy was a critically acclaimed newcomer to Nashville's music fold in 1989 and had charted six successful singles on Evergreen Records before tragedy struck. While out one evening on Nashville's famed 16th Avenue Music Row, he and friend Kevin Hughes were shot by a man wearing a ski mask. While Sammy survived serious injuries, Hughes, who was the Cash Box Chart manager, did not. Details on the motive for the shooting would reveal a payola scandal that brought down the magazine and rocked the country music industry. It became known around the world as the Murder on Music Row.

Through pain and challenges, one thing that never changed was Sadler's love for country music. He kept his desire to get back out on the road, performing for audiences. He's gone on to have three Billboard records, four top 15 records on the Texas Country Music Charts, and was named Dallas Fort Worth Male Artist of the Year. Sammy has recorded with Steve Wariner, T Graham Brown, John Anderson, and many others. His drive and perseverance have brought Sammy the ongoing respect of the music industry.

Paulette Carlson and Sammy Sadler offer a unique combination of country music history and chart-topping hits. It will be an incredible evening of great music that will captivate and inspire audiences both young and old.
